A **free, evidence-based app** from the Raising Children Network, funded by the Australian Government, designed to help parents and carers support their **social and emotional wellbeing** of children aged **0-12 years**. It's trustworthy, non-commercial and developed with input from experts and parents.

## What it does:

- Gives **practical, age-tailored tips** and information about feelings, behaviour and wellbeing.
- Lets you explore a wide range of topics like anxiety, stress, friendships and resilience.
- Includes easy-to-read articles, videos and animations.
- Helps you recognise common worries and shows when extra support might be needed.
- Lets you bookmark useful content and receive helpful tips.

## Why it's useful:

It helps build your confidence and understanding of your child's emotional needs, promotes early help-seeking, and supports stronger parent-child connections.

You can download it for free on Apple and Android devices.





It's that time of year again! NAPLAN is just around the corner for our Yr 3 & Yr 5 students at Annunciation. These assessments (writing, reading, conventions of language and numeracy) offer a quick snapshot of your child's progress. They make up just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process.

The national testing window runs from **Wednesday 11th March to Monday 23rd March 2026**. Results will be provided to families later in the year. Please find further details in the information brochure attached.

## NAPLAN 2026

Information for parents and carers



### Why do students do NAPLAN?

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) is a literacy and numeracy assessment that students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 sit each year. It is the only national assessment all Australian students have the opportunity to undertake. As students progress through their school years, it is important to check how well they are learning the essential skills of reading, writing and numeracy. NAPLAN assesses the literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through the school curriculum, and allows parents and carers to see how their child is progressing against national proficiency standards. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. It does not replace ongoing assessments made by teachers about student performance, but it can provide teachers with more information about students' educational progress. NAPLAN also provides schools, education authorities and governments with information about how education programs are working, and whether young Australians are achieving important educational outcomes in literacy and numeracy.

### Your child will do the NAPLAN tests online

Online NAPLAN tests are designed to provide precise results and are engaging for students. The tests are tailored (or adaptive), which means that each test presents questions that may be more or less difficult depending on a student's responses. This helps students remain engaged with the assessment. Tailored testing allows a wider range of student abilities to be assessed and measures student achievement more precisely. A student's overall NAPLAN result is based on both the number and complexity of questions they answer correctly. Your child should not be concerned if they find questions challenging; they may be taking a more complex test pathway. All Year 3 students will continue to complete the writing assessment on paper.

### What does NAPLAN assess?

NAPLAN assesses literacy and numeracy skills that students are learning through their regular school curriculum. Students sit assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar and punctuation) and numeracy. The questions assess content aligned to the Australian Curriculum: English and Mathematics. All government and non-government education authorities contribute to the development of NAPLAN test materials. To find out more about NAPLAN, visit [nap.edu.au](http://nap.edu.au).

### Participation in NAPLAN

NAPLAN is for all Year 3, 5, 7 and 9 students. ACARA supports inclusive testing, so all students have the opportunity to participate in the National Assessment Program. Information on adjustments available for students with disability who have diverse functional abilities and needs is provided in the National protocols for test administration. Schools should work with parents, carers and students to identify, on a case-by-case basis, reasonable adjustments required for individual students with disability to access NAPLAN. To help inform these decisions, you may consult the [National protocols for test administration](#) (linked above), NAPLAN public demonstration site, the Guide for schools to assist students with disability to access NAPLAN, and our series of videos where parents, carers, teachers and students share their experiences in using NAPLAN adjustments. In exceptional circumstances, a student with a disability that severely limits their capacity to participate in the assessment, or a student who has recently arrived in Australia and has a non-English speaking background, may be granted a formal exemption. Your school principal and your local test administration authority can give you more information on adjustments for students with disability or the process required to gain a formal exemption.

## What if my child is absent from school on NAPLAN test days?

Where possible, schools may arrange for individual students who are absent at the time of testing to complete missed tests at another time during the school's test schedule.

## What can I do to support my child?

Students are not expected to study for NAPLAN. You can support your child by letting them know that NAPLAN is a part of their school program and reminding them to simply do their best. Some explanation of NAPLAN is useful to help students understand and be comfortable with the format of the tests. However, it is not necessary for parents and carers to do this. Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the types of questions in the tests and will provide appropriate support and guidance. ACARA does not recommend excessive preparation for NAPLAN or the use of services by coaching providers. ## How is my child's performance reported?

NAPLAN results are reported against proficiency standards. There is a standard for each assessment area at each year level. Proficiency standards provide clear information on student achievement. They are set at a challenging but reasonable level expected of the child at the time of NAPLAN testing, based mainly on what has been taught in previous years of schooling.

Student achievement is shown against 4 levels of proficiency: Exceeding, Strong, Developing and Needs additional support.

A NAPLAN individual student report will be provided by your child's school later in the year. If you do not receive a report, you should contact your child's school. If further assistance is required, you should contact your relevant state or territory test administration authority. ACARA cannot provide individual student reports.

## How are NAPLAN results used?

- Students, parents and carers use individual results to discuss progress with teachers.
- Teachers use results to help identify students who need greater challenges or extra support.
- Schools use results to identify strengths and areas of need to improve teaching programs, and to set goals in literacy and numeracy.
- School systems use results to review the effectiveness of programs and support offered to schools.

## NAPLAN timetable

The NAPLAN test window is 9 days. This is to accommodate schools that may not have the capacity to complete the tests in a shorter time frame. The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 11 March 2026 and finishes on Monday 23 March 2026. Schools **must** schedule the tests as soon as possible within the testing window, prioritising the first week.

**2. Submit your completed application form.**

Ensure you provide all required documents with the application. A non-refundable application fee is required at the time of submission. Applications close mid-August each year.

**3. The College will conduct interviews of all applicants.**

Families will be invited to attend an enrolment interview with a senior staff member of the College.

**4. Enrolment and waiting list offers will be sent to families.**

Families will be notified of any offer after the interview process.

**5. Book a College Tour**


