A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL



Why School Attendance Matters

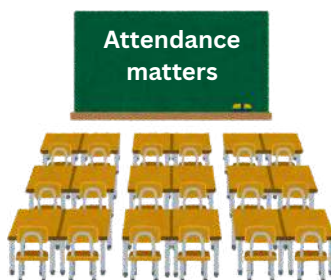
Regular school attendance is one of the most important factors in a child's learning and overall development. When students attend school consistently, they have greater opportunities to build knowledge, develop friendships, and feel connected to their school community. Research consistently shows that even small amounts of missed school time can have a significant impact on a child's learning and wellbeing.

Evidence from the Australian Institute for Teaching and School Leadership and the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority highlights that students who attend school regularly are far more likely to achieve strong academic outcomes. Data from the Australian Education Research Organisation shows that students who attend school **90% of the time or more** perform significantly better in reading and mathematics than students with lower attendance rates.

If a student is missing **about one day of school every two weeks** over the course of a school year, this adds up to around **four weeks of missed learning**. Over the years of primary school, this can equate to **more than half a year of learning lost**, making it much harder for students to keep up with their peers.

Regular attendance is also strongly linked to students' wellbeing and sense of belonging. The Australian Department of Education notes that students who attend school consistently are more likely to build positive relationships with teachers and classmates, develop confidence, and participate in the full life of the school. Being present each day helps students feel connected and supported within their learning environment.

Good attendance habits formed in primary school also set the foundation for future success. Studies show that students who attend school regularly are more likely to complete secondary school and pursue further education or employment opportunities.

Families play a vital role in supporting strong attendance. Establishing regular morning routines, planning holidays during school breaks, and encouraging children to attend school even when they may feel reluctant all help reinforce the importance of learning every day.

Every school day offers valuable opportunities for growth, learning, and connection. When students attend regularly, they are giving themselves the best possible chance to thrive both academically and socially. Together, schools and families can work in partnership to ensure that every child benefits from being present, engaged, and ready to learn each day.

To support accurate attendance records and student safety, parents and carers are asked to notify the school of any absences before 9:15 am on the day. This can be done by calling the school office, sending an email, or submitting the absence through the Audiri app. When notifying the school, please provide a brief reason for the absence. All absences must be recorded under specific categories such as illness, medical appointments, bereavement, cultural reasons, or other approved circumstances.

We understand that children will occasionally be unwell, and in these situations, it is always best for them to remain at home and recover. Where possible, families are encouraged to schedule medical appointments before or after school hours, or during school holidays, and to plan family holidays outside of the school term. These small steps help ensure that students are able to attend school regularly and make the most of every learning opportunity.

Below are some Tips to help improve your child's attendance taken from the Victorian Government website:

Setting up good attendance patterns and addressing attendance issues promptly can lead to future success and help your child feel more engaged and connected at school.

Here are some ideas which may assist you in supporting your child to attend school:

- Talk to your child about school and the importance of attending every day. You can ask them how they feel about school, what interests them or if they are having any difficulties. Some problems to look out for include:
 - – bullying or cyberbullying
 - – feeling isolated at school
 - – disliking or feeling disconnected from the school culture or environment
 - – falling behind in schoolwork or feeling overwhelmed about keeping up
 - – disliking school subjects, choice of subjects, or not feeling challenged by the work
 - – finding relationships with teachers or other students at school difficult
 - – competing demands on time, such as extracurricular activities
 - – not feeling understood and fully accepted by peers or teachers
 - – not experiencing cultural acknowledgement and understanding
- Encourage and celebrate good attendance habits with your child, including arriving at school on time every day.
- Set a good example. Show them how you keep to your own commitments.
- Encourage your child to take on hobbies at school that they enjoy such as sports and clubs. This will help them develop positive relationships outside of the classroom setting and can help your child feel part of a group, important to the school, and more motivated.
- Help your child maintain daily routines such as finishing homework and getting a good night's sleep.
- Help them pack their school bag the night before with everything they need.
- Have a set time for breakfast.
- Plan for your child to meet with a friend so they can travel to school together.

Remember, every day counts. Act early if you are concerned about your child's attendance and contact their school to discuss how you can work together to support positive attendance.

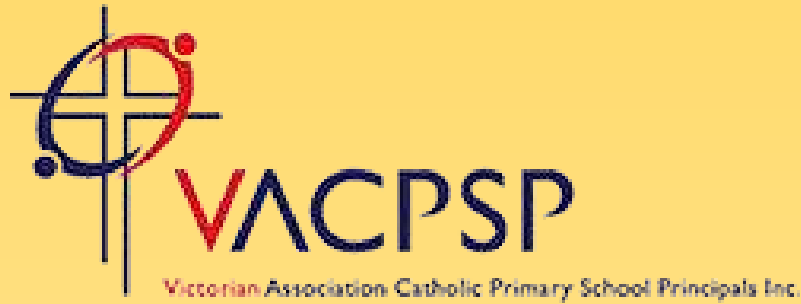

Later this month, (March 24–27) I will be attending the bi-annual conference hosted by the Victorian Association of Catholic Primary School Principals (VACPSP), which will be held in the beautiful coastal town of Lorne. This year's conference theme, "Nourish Your Purpose," promises to be a meaningful opportunity for reflection, professional learning, and connection with fellow Catholic primary school leaders from across Victoria.

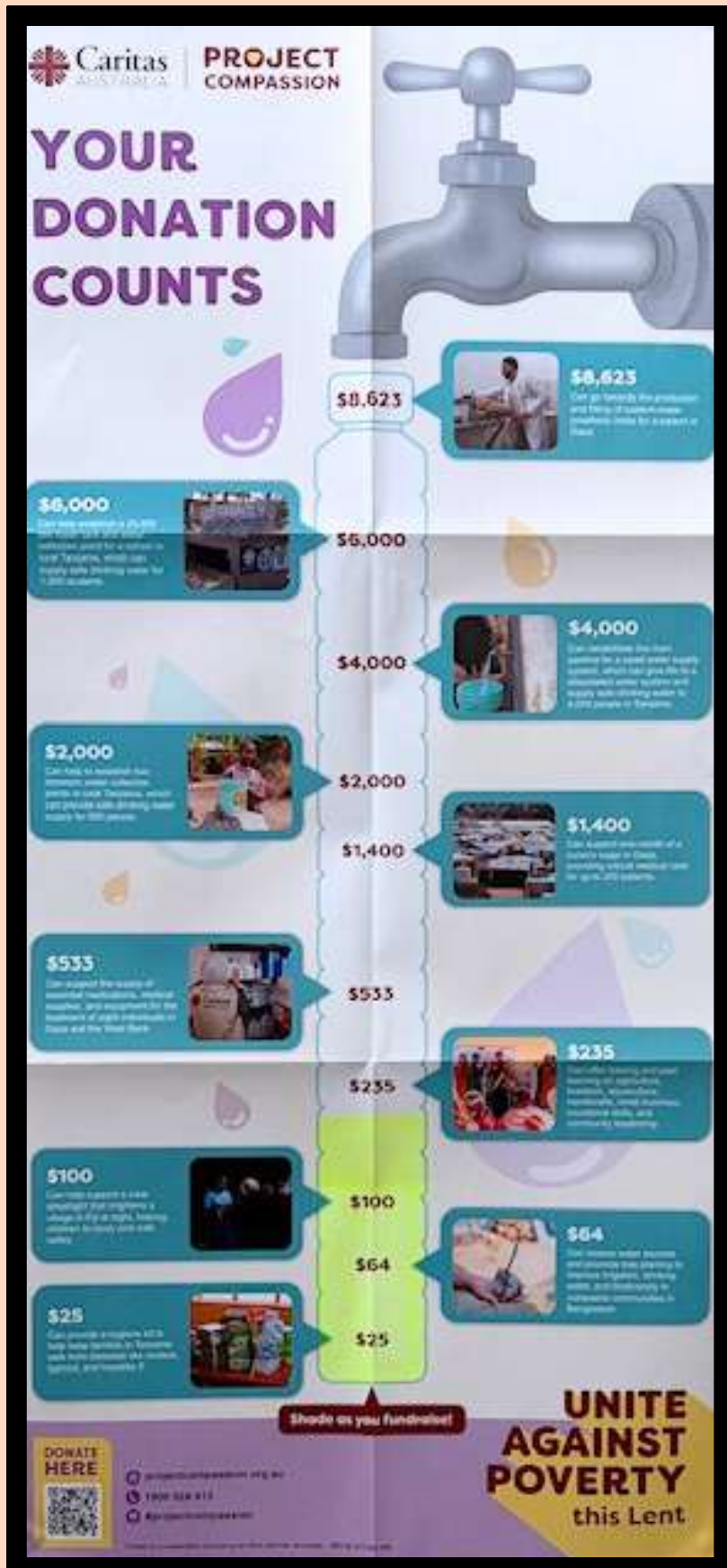
The three-day conference is thoughtfully structured around three key areas of leadership. Day One – Nourishing the Principal focuses on personal and professional growth, encouraging principals to reflect on their leadership journey and strengthen their capacity to lead with clarity and purpose. Day Two – Nourishing the Student will explore contemporary thinking around understanding young people and building inclusive school communities where every student feels valued and supported. Day Three – Nourishing the Team will focus on the importance of collaboration and the development of strong, high-performing teams within our school communities.

Across the conference, a number of guest speakers will share insights and practical strategies to support principals in their important role. Principals will deepen their understanding of how faith can be lived and expressed in contemporary life, strengthening pastoral leadership so that it remains meaningful and relevant within our communities. There will also be opportunities to engage with current thinking and frameworks around working with young people, strengthening connections with families, and fostering a strong sense of community within our schools.

Another important aspect of the conference is the opportunity to explore the dynamics of high-performing teams. NAPLAN UPDATE

This week, students across Australia experienced interruptions during the NAPLAN online assessments due to technical issues affecting the national testing platform. Unfortunately, our students were also impacted by these disruptions while completing some of their scheduled tests.

Following the advice of Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA), the school has adjusted and rescheduled parts of our NAPLAN timetable to ensure that all students have the opportunity to complete their assessments in a fair and supportive environment.

We would like to acknowledge how calm, patient and cooperative our students were during these unexpected interruptions. They demonstrated great resilience and maturity while staff worked to follow the guidance provided and reorganise the testing sessions.

We appreciate the support and understanding of our families as we continue to work through the updated schedule.

YEARS 3–6 LIFE SAVING EXCURSION – ALTONA BEACH



Recently, our students in Years 3–6 participated in an exciting and educational Life Saving excursion at Altona Beach. The day provided a valuable opportunity for students to learn important water safety skills while enjoying time at the beach.

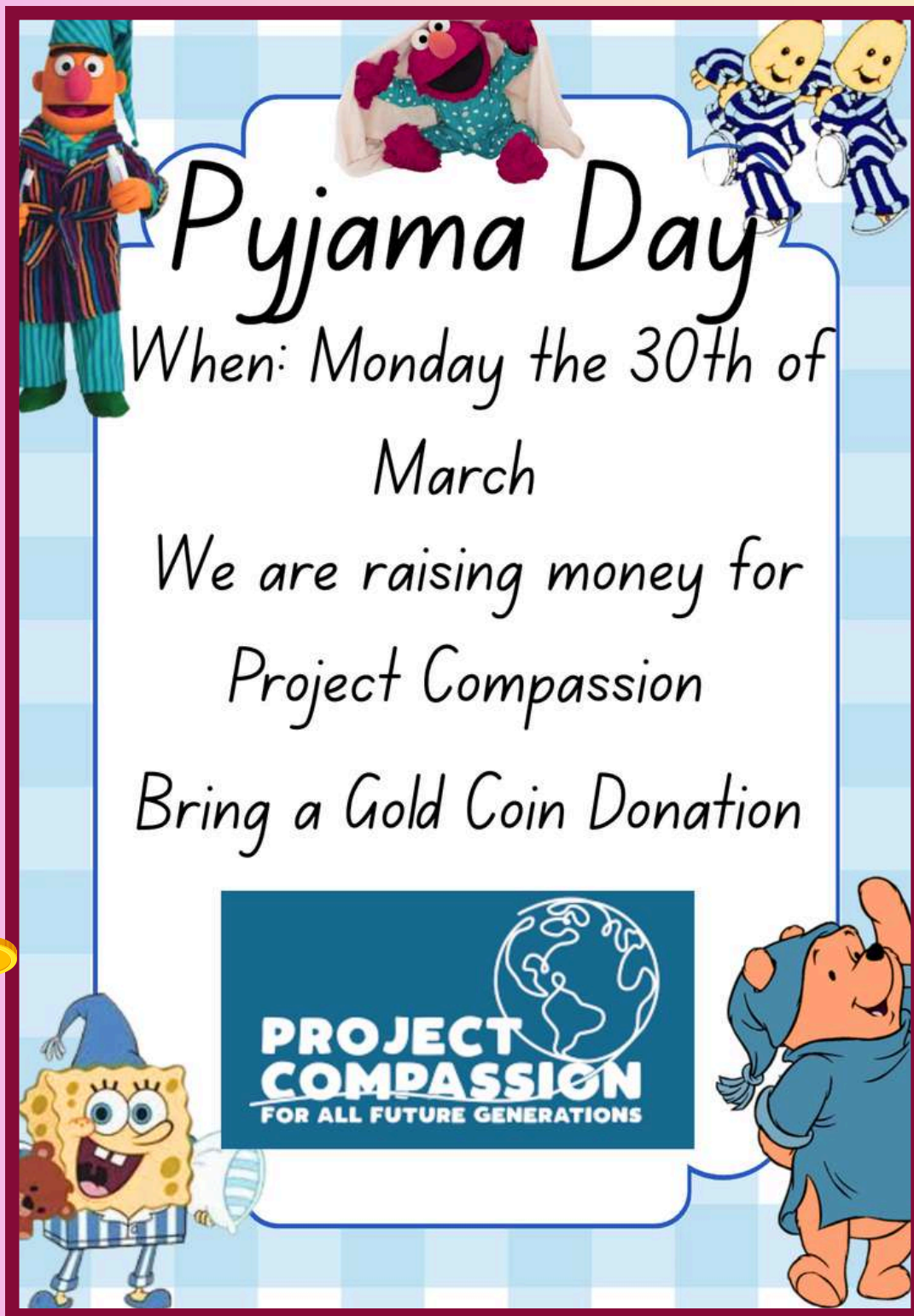
Although students were unable to enter the water due to higher than usual E. coli levels detected on the day, the experience was still extremely worthwhile. Life Saving instructors adapted the program so that students could participate in a range of engaging activities on the beach that focused on essential water safety knowledge and awareness.

Throughout the session, students learned about how to recognise safe and unsafe swimming conditions, the meaning of different beach flags, and the important role that lifeguards and lifesavers play in keeping beachgoers safe. They also practised a number of practical rescue and safety scenarios on the sand, helping them to better understand how to respond in an emergency and how to keep themselves and others safe around water.

Our students represented the school wonderfully, demonstrating excellent listening skills, teamwork and enthusiasm throughout the activities. Their positive participation ensured the day was both enjoyable and highly informative. Learning about water safety is particularly important in Australia, where beaches and waterways are such a big part of our lifestyle. Experiences like this help equip students with the knowledge and confidence they need to make safe choices when they are near water.

We thank the Life Saving educators for providing such an engaging program and commend our students for the way they participated so positively in the day.

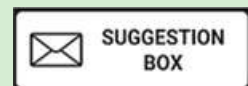
