PLEASE READ - CHILD SAFETY



As part of our ongoing commitment to child safety, new gates and fencing will be installed at the front of the school on Monday 22nd June. The existing gates at Nolan Avenue and the basketball court will be replaced with pool-style fencing, and an additional gate with a pool lock will be installed between the church and the brickwork near the community noticeboard. These improvements will allow the gates to remain closed throughout the school day, enhancing the security of our site while still enabling adults to access the office area when required. **This means that parents/adults will need to walk their child to the gate and open the gate for them.** The safety and wellbeing of all students remains our highest priority, and these upgrades are another important step in ensuring a secure learning environment for every child in our care.



PARENT TEACHER INTERVIEWS

Assessment & Reporting

nForma Connect

Last week some information went home to families via Audiri and email, regarding the set up of the nForma connect app and portal. As previously communicated, student academic reports will be sent home via the **nForma connect app/portal**. It is important that you log in and have access to nForma to view your child's report.

If you still require assistance with this, please contact the school and arrange a time to meet with Belinda.

Academic Reports

In line with the Reporting Guidelines from the Victorian Catholic Education Authority (VCEA), the scale used for reporting to English, Mathematics and Science must be an **age-expected scale** indicating how your child is progressing based on their age/year level at the time of reporting. As a school, we will be using this scale across all curriculum areas to maintain consistency for both teachers and families. The table below outlines the definition for each rating on the scale.

Age-expected scale definitions	
<i>N/A</i>	There is currently no/not enough evidence that your child has demonstrated the understanding/skill expected for their age group due to either; <ul style="list-style-type: none">● Non-attendance at school● Not applicable/assessed● Not enough evidence
<i>Well below expected standard</i>	With constant guidance of a staff member, your child has begun to demonstrate the understanding/skill expected for their age group.
<i>Below expected standard</i>	With some guidance of a staff member, your child has begun to demonstrate the understanding/skill expected for their age group.
<i>At standard</i>	Your child has independently demonstrated the understanding/skill expected for their age group.
<i>Above standard</i>	Your child has independently demonstrated a thorough understanding/skill above the expected standard for their age group.
<i>Well above standard</i>	Your child has independently and consistently demonstrated an exceptional understanding/skill well above the expected standard for their age group.

Should you have any questions or wish to discuss this further, please reach out to your child's classroom teacher. Parent/Teacher interviews will be held next week Wednesday June 24 (with the exception of Year 4/5), and offer a valuable opportunity to connect and collaborate on your child's progress.

MATHEMATICS AND NUMERACY AT HOME

This week, we are sharing the fourth and fifth videos in the Strengthening Number Sense at Home series:

Partitioning. Partitioning is a useful way of breaking numbers up into smaller parts, making them easier to work with. It is helpful for when you want to add or subtract larger numbers.

Teen Numbers. Learning teen numbers (11–19) is a critical developmental milestone. It builds the essential foundation for place value (understanding that numbers are made of tens and ones), which unlocks mental math and more advanced operations like addition and subtraction

We encourage Foundation to Year 2 families to watch the short videos and try some of the simple ideas at home to support your child's maths learning.

THE FIFA WORLD CUP JOURNEY BEGINS!

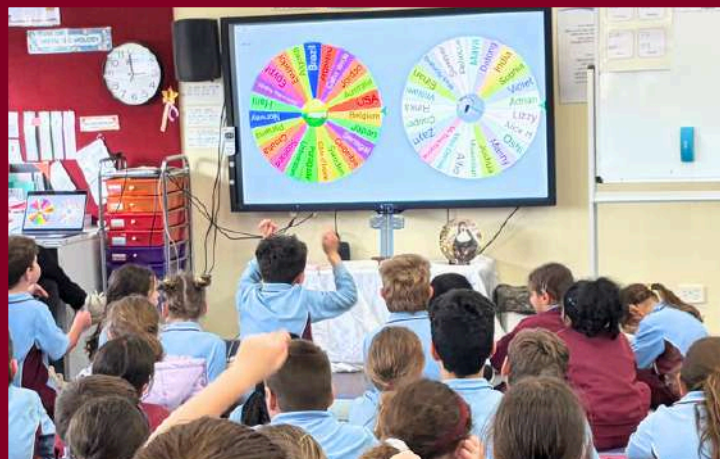
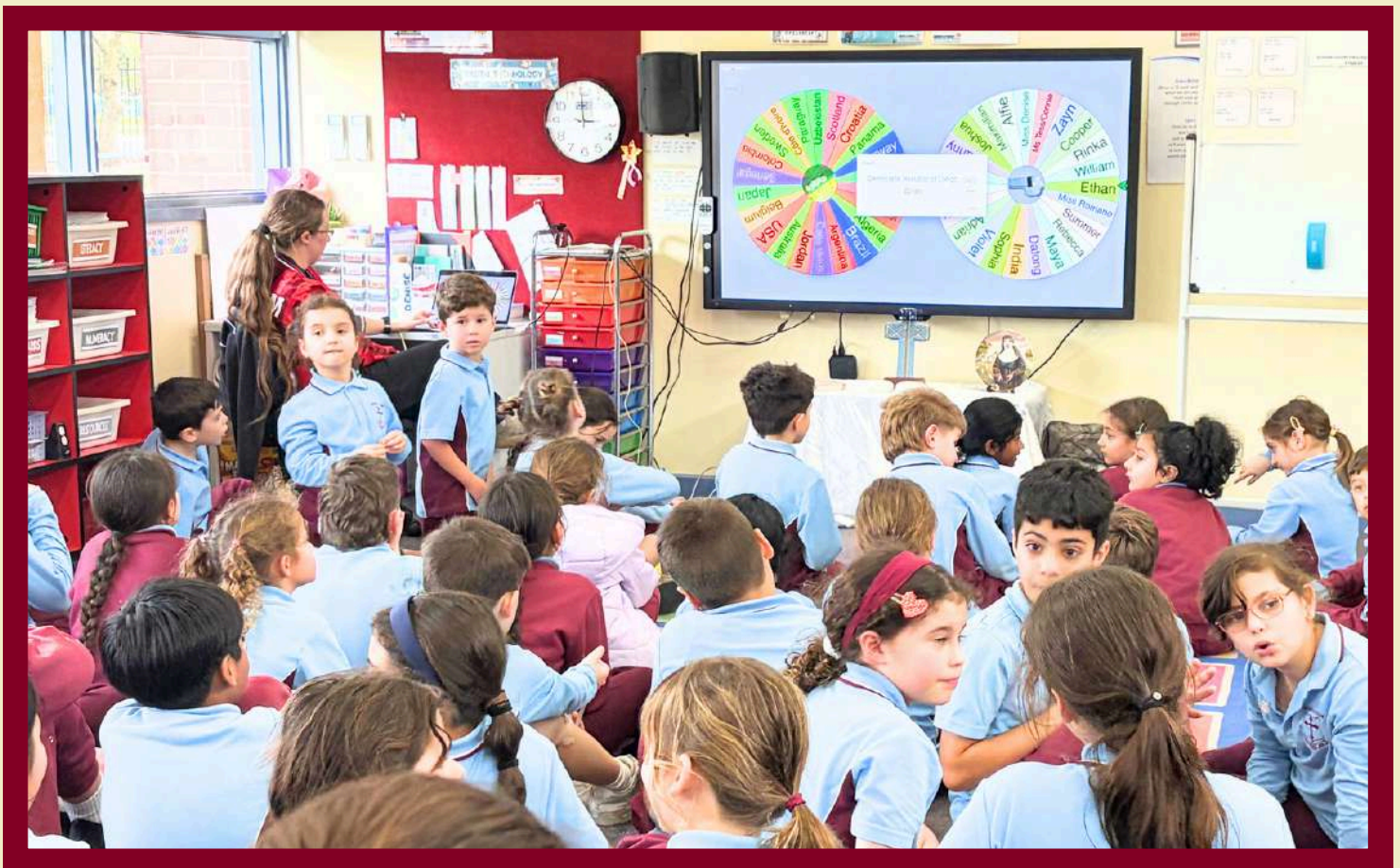

- ✓ A Risk Minimisation and Communication Plan must be completed for children with a diagnosed health-care need, allergy or relevant medical condition. If one has not yet been completed, our educators will assist you to complete it on your child's first day of attendance.
- ✓ Provide the prescribed medication as listed on the plan, in its original packaging and clearly labelled with your child's name.



These documents and processes are legal requirements under the Education & Care National Regulations.

In the interests of children's health and safety, care may be refused or delayed if the required documentation and medication have not been supplied.

Excursions

Please arrive by 8.30am so we can leave on time, and ensure the children don't miss out.

If your child is attending an excursion, please complete a permission form at the service on the morning of the excursion.

The excursion risk assessment will be available for you to view on the day.

Drop off and pick up

All children must be picked up each day by an authorised adult. Please ensure you sign your child in and out each day on the service iPad.

How to Book

Step 1: Check if your child is enrolled at this school

- If your child attends OSHC at the school hosting the holiday program, go straight to Step 3 to start booking.
- If your child attends OSHC at a different school or does not attend OSHC, go to Step 2 and complete the enrolment form. This includes children attending MACSEYE OSHC at other schools.

Step 2: Complete the enrolment form by 19 June

- Scan or click the QR Code and complete the enrolment form.
- Once your enrolment is confirmed, we will email you a unique link to download the Xplor Home App.



Step 3: Book your days

- Book holiday program days via the Xplor Home App.



Important

- New enrolments must be submitted by 19 June.
- Walk-ins cannot be accepted.
- The enrolment process must be completed before your child attends the program. This includes ensuring all medical and supporting documents have been provided.

Child Care Subsidy

MACSEYE's holiday program is approved for the Child Care Subsidy (CCS), allowing eligible families to reduce their out-of-pocket expenses. To check your eligibility for CCS, visit the Services Australia website or login to your MyGov account.

Cancellation policy

Minimum of 7 days' notice is required for booking cancellations.

Normal fees apply for cancellations outside the minimum notice period and the booking will be recorded as an absence.

CCS will be applied to the absence, and the gap fee will still be payable.

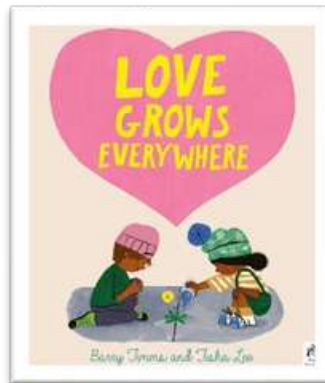
