SCHOOL UNIFORM

We want to inform you about some additions to the school uniform. These changes have been made to ensure comfort, practicality, and consistency in our dress code.

To help students and families adjust, we'll be implementing a transition period. During this time, both the current and updated uniform options will be allowed, giving everyone the chance to make adjustments smoothly. It is expected that all students will be wearing the new uniform from the beginning of the 2026 school year.

The new additions include a Winter tunic/pinafore, a maroon/burgundy skort (Sports Day) and a new polo shirt that has the school logo embroidered on the front. The tunic and skort provide another option for students as the grey trousers and shorts will also be available. The polo shirt is of a much higher quality than what we currently have.

It has been decided that we won't offer the spray jacket at this stage due to the cost. All orders can be placed via the school office.

Students participated in a variety of soccer games, using the soccer balls they created. All in all, it was an incredibly fun afternoon, and we raised a grand total of \$108,60.





The Peaceful Kids program started last week. Students who participated were very positive and excited about the program. The Peaceful Kids Program runs for 8 weeks. Each session is 1 hour a week. Students are selected by staff for this program. It will be offered again throughout 2025.

Things that were covered this week were:

- To identify how they are feeling, learn names for feelings and gain more insight into their own feelings and how they can change them with effective coping strategies.
- That anxiety and worry are normal feelings that everyone experiences.
- An Introduction into mindfulness Meditation through the Breath Meditation
- ●To learn how to calm themselves down when they are feeling anxious through using breath meditation.
