NAPLAN



NAPLAN is a national literacy & numeracy assessment that students at Annunciation in Yr 3 & Yr 5 sit each year. The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 13th March and finishes on Monday 25th March 2023.

Students will sit a series of assessments throughout the fortnight. Students sit assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar,

punctuation) and numeracy. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. Results will be provided to families later in the year. If you have any queries, please see your child's classroom teacher.

CERES EXCURSION -

On Monday 19th February, the Annunciation students travelled to CERES Environmental Park in Brunswick to take part in the Indigenous Perspectives program. CERES is located next to the beautiful Merri Creek, a traditional site for large gatherings of the Wurundjeri people. As such, it was the perfect place for our students to learn about Aboriginal culture.

The students had a fun and educational experience learning about bush foods (saltbush got the thumbs up, bush spinach not so much), acting out Dreamtime stories, and playing a game of Marngrook - a traditional indigenous football game. As well as that, CERES had one of the 'coolest playgrounds ever', according to some of the Year 3 students.



All in all, this excursion was a valuable way to immerse our students in the history and culture of the Aboriginal people of Australia, which will be the lens through which they study History throughout Term 1.

In our upcoming beach program, students will embark on an exciting journey where safety remains our top priority. Students will delve into essential skills like CPR, becoming everyday lifesavers equipped to respond confidently in emergencies.

Emphasizing the mantra "Be Aware and Be Prepared," they will learn about water safety principles, understanding the importance of recognising potential risks and taking proactive measures to mitigate them. As they hit the waves, survival strategies such as donning life jackets will be instilled, ensuring they have the necessary tools to stay afloat and secure in any situation. Moreover, they'll explore rescue strategies, learning how to assist others effectively and responsibly in distress scenarios. Amidst the thrill of bodyboarding, students will practice safe techniques, ensuring they enjoy the waves while prioritising their well-being.

This comprehensive approach will not only enrich their beach experience but also empower them with lifelong skills that promote safety and confidence in aquatic environments.




SCHOLASTIC BOOK CLUB
