

The Feast of the Annunciation celebrates the moment when the angel Gabriel visits the Virgin Mary to announce that she will conceive and give birth to Jesus, the Son of God. The students spent the morning in class learning about this story, and taking part in activities related to Mary and the Annunciation.

The idea for Crazy Clothes and Hair Day came from the 3/4 students, who wanted to find a way to raise money for Project Compassion, Caritas Australia's fundraising campaign. Along with thousands of other Australians, Annunciation supports Project Compassion each year in solidarity to help end poverty, promote justice and uphold dignity.



# RAISED PEDESTRIAN CROSSING AND SPEED HUMPS FOR SAFE CHILDREN CROSSING NEAR ANNUNCIATION PRIMARY SCHOOL

As part of the Safe Travel to School Program, Hobson Bay City Council is commencing safety improvement works for vulnerable road users at the intersection of Nolan Avenue and Heather Avenue which includes a dedicated pedestrian crossing. Other work includes construction of flat top speed humps at Nolan Avenue and Eames Avenue approaches to the school.

Works are expected to commence in early April 2024 and will take approximately 2 weeks to complete, weather dependent.

Traffic management will be in place during these works and access to the properties will be maintained. Waste collection shall continue as normal. Your patience would be greatly appreciated until the works are complete.
