#### VISIBLE LEARNING

As many of you would be aware we are into our 3rd year of participating in a project based on Visible Learning. As part of this project a consultant comes to our school twice a year to speak to our students and teachers and to assess where we are and how we are going. Visible Learning is all about our students knowing how to learn and which strategies they can independently deploy when they are stuck. When we first started this journey many students saw effective learning as being someone who listened and wrote neatly etc. Now the talk is all about using positive mindsets and how they can self manage their own learning.

The consultant Vania sent through a report from her visit last week and the feedback was truly amazing. She could not believe how far we have come as a school and the difference in the students being able to articulate what they are learning and where they need to go next.

She was so impressed that she suggested we apply to have our school acknowledged as part of an award that is offered. We will definitely do this so stay tuned!


