A MESSAGE FROM THE PRINCIPAL

A Sacred Pilgrimage: Following in the Footsteps of St. Paul

I am very excited to share that I will be embarking on a special pilgrimage to Greece and Turkey in the upcoming weeks, following in the footsteps of St. Paul. As part of a group of Principals travelling together on this journey, we have been preparing for the past year, immersing ourselves in learning about St. Paul and his incredible missionary work. This spiritual journey, rooted in the rich history of early Christianity, will provide a deeper understanding of St. Paul's missionary work and how he shared the message of the Gospel. I will be visiting key biblical sites, such as Athens, Ephesus, and Corinth, and will be reflecting on the profound impact these places had on the early Church and the message of hope they continue to carry today.

This pilgrimage takes on even greater significance as 2025 marks the Year of Jubilee, with the theme "Pilgrims of Hope." The Year of Jubilee is a time of renewal and spiritual reflection, encouraging all of us to deepen our faith and grow in hope. By walking in the footsteps of St. Paul, I will not only experience the sacredness of these historic sites but will also carry the intentions and prayers of our school community with them, bringing our shared hopes and dreams before God.

As a school community, I invite all families to join in prayer for this journey. May it inspire a deeper sense of pilgrimage in our own lives, reminding us that we, too, are pilgrims of hope, walking together on a path toward faith, renewal, and peace.

I have full confidence in his leadership and know that he will continue to support our students, staff, and school community. I trust that you will extend him your support during this time, and I look forward to sharing my experiences and reflections with you upon my return. I will be on leave from 26th March and return to school on Monday 28th April.

ALTONA BEACH LIFESAVING EXCURSION

On Tuesday 4th March, our Year 3-6 students had the opportunity to take part in a fun and educational Life Saving Program at the beach. The day was filled with exciting activities, all while learning essential beach safety skills that could one day save lives.

The weather was absolutely perfect, with clear skies, a warm sun, and a gentle breeze. It was an ideal setting for the students to engage in outdoor learning. Everyone enjoyed the opportunity to be by the sea, making it a memorable experience for all.

The program, led by certified life-saving instructors, was designed to teach the students a range of important skills. They learned how to identify potential dangers on the beach, including rip currents, and how to safely navigate the surf. The students practiced basic first aid, including how to assess and respond to an emergency, as well as techniques for safely helping someone in distress in the water.

One of the most exciting parts of the day was the hands-on experience of using rescue boards and practising simulated rescues. The students took turns demonstrating their new skills, with plenty of laughter and teamwork throughout the activity. It was inspiring to see how seriously the students took their training and how well they worked together.

We are incredibly proud of the students' excellent behaviour throughout the day. They listened attentively, participated eagerly in all activities, and demonstrated great respect for their instructors and peers. Their enthusiasm and positive attitude made the day even more enjoyable for everyone involved.

This experience was not only fun but also helped to instill important life skills, such as responsibility, teamwork, and awareness of safety in the water. We look forward to seeing how the students apply these lessons in the future, both on the beach and in their everyday lives.

The first term of learning as part of our year-long participation in the **Inform & Empower** project has wrapped up. Inform & Empower promotes digital safety and wellbeing within schools by supporting **students**, **teachers and parents**, through online learning delivered by experts in education and psychology.

This term, all students took part in live-streamed incursions covering a range of topics. Students in **Year F-3** focused on making clever screen time choices, how to take care of devices, and strategies for sharing devices with others.

The learning for **Years 2-4** covered what the internet is, how listening to our body can help us recognise early warning signs, and how trusted adults can help us stay safe online. They also learned what the internet is and how it works, and explored the rights and responsibilities of digital citizens.

Students in **Year 5/6** focused on rights and responsibilities as digital citizens, whilst considering that what we post is possibly public and permanent.

The **teachers** at Annunciation also took part in a fascinating professional learning session as part of the project, where there were some eye-opening insights into the current landscape of the online world, including gaming, social media and artificial intelligence.

Students and teachers will continue their learning with Inform & Empower throughout the year.

There will also be a parent webinar on Thursday 15th May at 7.30pm that will cover topics such as:

- Social Media
- Online Gaming
- Managing Conflict
- Impacts of Screen Time
- Cyberbullying
- Family Communication

NATIONAL RIDE2SCHOOL DAY 2025


Annunciation is excited to be celebrating National Ride2School Day on Friday 21st March 2024
