PRINCIPAL MESSAGE:

Reflections from my recent trip to Tasmania - Indigenous Spirituality Tour

Earlier this term, I had the honour of participating in a week-long tour of Tasmania alongside 32 other Principals from the Western Zone. Taking part in an Indigenous spiritual tour of Tasmania was an eye-opening and deeply meaningful experience. It allowed me to gain a profound understanding and appreciation for the rich cultural heritage of the Indigenous people of Tasmania.

Throughout the tour, I had the privilege of learning directly from the Aboriginal guides, who generously shared their knowledge, stories, and spiritual practices. They guided us through sacred sites, such as ancient rock formations and significant natural landmarks, where they recounted the deep spiritual connections, their ancestors had with the land.

One aspect that struck me was the emphasis on the interconnectedness of all living beings and the land itself. The guides conveyed the importance of respecting and caring for the environment, as it sustains not only human life but also the spirits of their ancestors. This perspective served as a powerful reminder of our responsibility to be stewards of the Earth and to cultivate a harmonious relationship with nature.



The tour also shed light on the history of colonization and its devastating impact on the Aboriginal communities of Tasmania. Through honest and sometimes difficult conversations, we confronted the dark chapters of Australia's past and the ongoing struggle for recognition, land rights, and cultural preservation.

This journey of reflection and immersion in Indigenous spirituality has left a lasting impact on me. It has ignited a desire to further educate myself about the histories, cultures, and ongoing challenges faced by Indigenous peoples not only in Tasmania but throughout the world. It has also reinforced the importance of promoting cultural understanding, respect, and reconciliation in our society.

NEW IPAD PURCHASES & APPLE TVs

Annunciation recently purchased 40 new iPad and new TVs to replace the interactive whiteboards in the Yr 3/4 & Yr 5/6 classrooms. TVs will also be installed in the staffroom and planning room. Apple TV allows for seamless integration with other Apple devices such as iPad and Macs. This integration can enhance the classroom experience by allowing teachers and students to wirelessly share their screens, presentations, or other content with the entire class.



It simplifies the process of displaying multimedia content, educational apps, or interactive materials. Teachers can create dynamic and immersive lessons by utilizing features like screen mirroring, video playback, annotation tools, and interactive quizzes. These capabilities enhance student engagement, facilitate active participation, and encourage a more personalized learning environment. Installation will occur during the school holidays. I'm sure the students and teachers will appreciate these new purchases.

REINVENT THE CLASSROOM

As mentioned in previous newsletters, staff at Annunciation are participating in a year long project with staff from St Peter's, South West Sunshine titled: *Reinvent the Classroom (RTCi)*.

This program is facilitated by HP (Hewlett Packard), supported by MACS (Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools) and aims to support staff in modernizing their teaching and learning processes and to develop their technology blueprint.

This week, staff at Annunciation worked closely with Adrian from (RTCi) on implementing technology into their everyday teaching. St Peter's staff joined us for a staff meeting where more learning, collaborating & investigating occurred. Two great Catholic schools working together for the benefit of their students.







SCHOOL REVIEW CLOSURE DAYS





Staff worked diligently on the school review over the two school closure days. All staff were involved in a series of workshops where they worked through a process of dialogue and collaboration. There are 5 spheres that the school is audited on:

- 1. Religious Dimension
- 2. Learning & Teaching
- 3. Leadership & Management
- 4. Student Wellbeing
- 5. School Community

Each sphere outlines particular criteria that needs to be agreed upon by staff as to where Annunciation is currently placed. I am extremely proud of the way in which staff engaged in authentic and challenging conversations throughout these two days.

The next step is for the audited spheres to be sent off to the reviewer. The reviewer will decipher the information and then visit the school in mid-August where she will meet with staff, students and families before making some final recommendations. These recommendations will assist staff in setting goals for the next School Improvement Plan (2024-2027).

SCHOOLTV SPECIAL REPORT: SOCIAL MEDIA INFLUENCERS

Social media influencers have become powerful individuals who often shape the opinions and beliefs of others due to strong connections with their audiences. In today's fast-paced digital world, attention has become a valuable commodity.

However, the impact of social media influencers on youth mental health is a growing concern, most recently, the controversial actions and statements of Andrew Tate. His rise to fame has made him a polarising figure, amassing a significant following of mostly young males. Educators and families have raised urgent concerns about the damaging nature of Tate's content, worried that his messages may radicalise students and create a generation of young men with regressive and harmful beliefs.



Young people often compare themselves to the idealised lives presented by influencers, leading to feelings of inadequacy, low self-worth and dissatisfaction. Social media algorithms may also expose them to inappropriate or harmful content such as explicit material, promotion of harmful behaviours, or distorted perceptions of body image or mental health.

It is important to guide a young person's social media use and promote open communication. Be curious to comprehend why they might be drawn to radical influencers, like Andrew Tate, and actively seek understanding as part of the solution. While not all influencers have a negative impact, parents play a vital role in ensuring a balanced approach to social media. By actively modelling kindness, respect and positive values, parents can help tackle the sway of radical influencers and be part of the solution to countering unhealthy masculinity.

This Special Report provides guidance on how to respond to misinformation and disinformation, instead encouraging critical thinking and emphasising the value of real-life connections. We hope you take a moment to reflect on the information offered, and as always, we welcome your feedback. If this raises any concerns for you, a loved one or the wellbeing of your child, please consider seeking medical or professional help.

This fortnight's maths question might cause a bit of a stir in the school community...


Are there more wheels in the world or more doors in the world?
