

SHROVE (PANCAKE) TUESDAY - TUESDAY 4TH MARCH

Staff will make pancakes using pre-mixed pancake shakes that can be purchased from the supermarket and just add water on the day or they will be made from scratch (depending on the teacher). They will use margarine or oil to cook on electric frypans and toasty makers.

Your child is asked to bring a small amount of their favourite topping in a container, to put on their pancakes. Please send these with your child to school on Tuesday. For safety reasons, please refrain from sending any nut products. To keep safe, there will be no sharing of food/toppings. All other cutlery and cooking materials will be provided.

ALTONA BEACH LIFESAVING EXCURSION - TUESDAY 4TH MARCH

The Year 3–6 students will be taking part in a lifesaving excursion on Tuesday 4th March at Alton Beach. The students are to wear their sports uniform to and from the venue. They can wear their bathers to the life-saving club but will need to have dry underwear to change into after the program.

All students will be going into the water so they will need to bring the following: Bathers, lightweight long sleeve shirt, wide brimmed hat (school hats are ideal), warm clothing and spare towel in case of cool weather, enclosed shoes that can be worn in and out of the water (please make sure they are not expensive shoes as this is salt water and they may get damaged), sunscreen, sunglasses, comb/hairbrush and rash vest if they have one.

It is important that they bring a snack in a clearly labelled plastic bag. It is also important that they have a clearly labelled drink bottle. The students will have their lunch before departing at 11.45am.

NAPLAN

NAPLAN is a national literacy & numeracy assessment that students at Annunciation in Yr 3 & Yr 5 sit each year. The NAPLAN test window starts on Wednesday 12th March and finishes on Monday 24th March 2025.

Students will sit a series of assessments throughout the fortnight. Students sit assessments in writing, reading, conventions of language (spelling, grammar, punctuation) and numeracy. NAPLAN is just one aspect of a school's assessment and reporting process. Results will be provided to families later in the year. If you have any queries, please see your child's classroom teacher.

ENROLMENT INFORMATION

Children who turn 5 years of age by 30th April 2026 are eligible to enrol in Foundation 2026.

BROOKLYN STORIES ART PROJECT

This week, we were lucky to have two local artists, Geoffrey Ricardo and Heidi Weatherald visit our students to work on a community art project called 'Brooklyn Stories'. Brooklyn Stories is a collaboration between Hobsons Bay City Council and Deakin Motion Lab (DML), aiming to bring to light some of the hidden histories of Brooklyn, through an innovative blend of Augmented Reality (AR) technologies and participatory storytelling/creative art workshops.

Annunciation students were tasked with imagining the stories and characters of Brooklyn's future. During a fun-packed two-hour workshop, they had opportunities to dramatise the history of Brooklyn's development, and then use painting and sculpture to create characters they imagine inhabiting Brooklyn in the future.

Geoffrey and Heidi will be back to work with the students and finish their creations on Tuesday 1st April. After that, their designs and ideas may then be used by Deakin Motion Lab to create digital avatars that will be accessed using QR codes placed around the Brooklyn community.

















GARDENING CLUB


Who likes potatoes?

Hi Everyone,

I hope you all had a fantastic break over the Summer. I have just come back from Long Service Leave where I had the opportunity to go overseas and reconnect with my parent's homeland of Malta, but it's wonderful to be back here at Annunciation for another year.

I continue in my role as Mental Health Leader this year, supporting students and staff in looking after their own mental health and wellbeing.

I will be offering the Peaceful Kids Program again in Term 2. This is a positive psychology program that helps children manage their anxiety and introduces strategies such as mindfulness and helps to build their emotional resilience. Children are selected for this program by the child's classroom teacher and the Wellbeing Leader.



I have qualified in Initiatic Art Therapy and Clay Field Therapy for children. Art Therapy supports children in regulating their nervous system and helps them to release trauma and tension that they may carry in their bodies.
