COVID SAFE PRACTICES

Unfortunately this week has shown all Victorians that we need to continue to be vigilant. Masks now need to be worn inside so I do ask that if you do need to come into the school that you have a mask on. We have spares if you forget.

We are continuing with the daily sanitising and cleaning and we do have a COVID Safe plan specific to our school. If your child is unwell we ask that you keep them at home and if you are identified as a close contact to a known case we ask that you notify the school so that we can follow correct guidelines.

SCHOOL ASSEMBLIES

We will only be able to do assemblies (with Parents) outdoors now that restrictions have lowered the number of people inside. We will endeavour to have them outdoors but unfortunately families will not be able to attend if the weather is too hot or wet as we will need to gather inside. Assemblies are at 3:10pm on a Friday afternoon.



FUNDING

As you may have heard in the media, schools were given some money to support children returning to school after 2020. This was worked out per student and we have been able to employ a Maths Intervention teacher for several hours per week. The staff and I have looked at other interventions and we now have quite a few running throughout the school. These include Reading Recovery, GREAD (a reading/comprehension program), Maths individualised sessions, ERIC (reading program) and a Wellbeing program. All these interventions are aimed to build confidence and develop skills in the areas of Maths, English and Wellbeing. We are incredibly fortunate to have so many staff that have the expertise to implement a diverse range of programs. We will continue to revise these programs as the year goes on.

UNIFORMS

Our school uniform is something that we take pride in so I ask that all parents please ensure that their child is dressed in the correct uniform from next week.




All children need to have black school shoes and not runners on Monday to Thursday. This includes Grade 6 children as there is still a year left of school. Boys need to be wearing grey socks too as I have noticed sports socks on a few of the older children. Apologies to families who are still waiting for uniform, unfortunately we just have to wait for deliveries which have been delayed.

WELCOME PICNIC AND INFORMATION NIGHT

On Tuesday February 16th we are hosting a welcome picnic/information session for all families. At 5:30pm we ask all families to come to the school. Students will play outside from 5:30 to 6pm (staff supervising) whilst parents attend a brief session with their child's classroom teachers. Each teacher will cover expectations/excursions/camp etc.



Due to the 1.5 meter COVID safe rule we are asking that only one parent attend the session. In the event that you have more than one child you can have an adult attend separate sessions or choose one session and we will pass on the information from the other classes.. After the session we are having a picnic. We ask families to bring their dinner and a rug or camp chairs. This will be a lovely opportunity to meet other families or to catch up with those that you know and may not have seen for a while. We have also organised an ice cream truck to come along!

CAMPS, SPORTS & EXCURSIONS FUND (CSEF)

A reminder that families who hold a valid Health Care Card for the 2021 year are able to receive a government rebate through the Camp, Sports and Excursion Fund (CSEF.)

CSEF is provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school trips, camps and sporting activities. If you hold a valid means-tested concession card or are a temporary foster parent, you may be eligible for CSEF.

The allowance is paid to the school to use towards expenses relating to camps, excursions or sporting activities for the benefit of your child. The annual CSEF amount per student is: • \$125 for primary school students. For more information about the CSEF visit www.education.vic.gov.au/csef

HOW TO APPLY: New applicants should contact the school office to obtain a CSEF application form or download from www.education.vic.gov.au/csef. If you applied for the CSEF at your child's school in 2020, you do not need to complete an application form in 2021, unless there has been a change in your family circumstances. You only need to complete an application form (AVAILABLE THROUGH THE OFFICE) if any of the following changes have occurred:

new student enrolments;

- ❖ your child has started or changed schools in 2021 or you did not apply in 2020.
- changed family circumstances; such as a change of custody, change of name, concession card number
- or new siblings commencing at the school in 2021.

Check with the school office if you are unsure.

Also families who hold a valid Health Care Card for the 2021 year are eligible for a rebate from the school in addition to the Camp, Excursion and Sports (CSEF) fund provided by the Government.


