PRINCIPAL'S REFLECTION

As our students recently celebrated their own special moments receiving the Sacraments of First Eucharist and Confirmation, it's inspiring to reflect on the rich history of baptism and faith in the early Church. One powerful story that connects us to those beginnings is that of Lydia, whose Baptistery I had the privilege of visiting during my recent Principal Pilgrimage.

On the Sabbath day, Paul and his companions went outside the city gate by the river—where they knew people gathered to pray—and there they met a group of women. Among them was Lydia, a worshiper of God from the city of Thyatira, who sold purple cloth. The Lord opened her heart to listen eagerly to Paul's message. After she and her household were baptised, Lydia warmly invited Paul and his friends to stay at her home, saying, "If you consider me faithful to the Lord, please come and stay with us." (Acts 16:13–15)

I recently visited the town of Krynides in the Kavala region, near the ancient city of Philippi, where Lydia's Baptistery is located. It was here that Paul first came to Philippi during his first journey to Greece around 49–50 AD. Since Philippi had no synagogue, Paul and Silas went down to the river outside the city gate, where they found a place of prayer along the banks of the Zigaktis River. It was in this peaceful spot that Paul's message was first heard by a group of women—including Lydia, who dealt in precious purple dye, a valuable commodity of the time.

What really stands out in Lydia's story is her incredible hospitality. Not only did she respond to Paul's message by being baptised along with her household—making her the first Greek and first European woman baptised by Paul—but she also immediately offered her home as a place of welcome and support. In a time when women often had limited social power, Lydia's decision to open her home was a powerful act of faith and service, showing the vital role women played in the early Church. Her story reminds us that the Gospel is for everyone, regardless of gender, status, or background.

From the outside, the Baptistery might look like a typical religious building, but once inside, its true beauty and meaning come alive. The floor features a stunning mosaic showing many of the places Paul visited on his journeys. At the centre stands a marble font used for infant baptism, while on either side, rooms were designed to prepare adults for baptism, which traditionally takes place in the river nearby.

The Baptistery is also adorned with beautiful art—icons, stained glass, and intricate mosaics that bring to life the story of Paul's time in Philippi. Scenes from the life of St Paul decorate the walls and arches, creating a space filled with history, faith, and inspiration.

On the riverbank, where tradition holds that Lydia was baptised, there is an open-air baptistery shaped like a cross, reminiscent of early Christian basilicas in Philippi. Every year on May 20, the feast day of Saint Lydia, baptisms are performed here to honour her memory and the new life in Christ she embraced.

Our group was led in the most beautiful prayer by our Faith Leader, where we renewed our Baptismal promises and were signed with the cross by our colleagues – a symbol of our Baptism.













SCHOOL UNIFORM

If your child is experiencing symptoms such as fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose, fatigue, or body aches, please keep them home and monitor their condition. Children should only return to school once they are symptom-free and feeling well enough to participate in class activities.

Students had fun creating Autumn leaf art using leaves and paint pens. You can check out their creations in the outdoor display cabinet at the entrance to to school.










The veggie garden was also weeded and watered. Lettuce, spinach and herbs were harvested and Leo our scarecrow got some new stuffing and was placed back into the garden.



NATIONAL SIMULTANEOUS STORYTIME

On Wednesday 21st May, Annunciation students participated in National Simultaneous Storytime. (NSS). NSS is held annually by the Australian Library and Information Association (ALIA). Every year a picture book, written and illustrated by an Australian author and illustrator, is read simultaneously in libraries, schools, pre-schools, childcare centres, family homes, bookshops and many other places around the country. It is a colourful, vibrant, fun event that aims to promote the value of reading and literacy.



This year, the chosen book for NSS was The Truck Cat by Deborah Frankel and Danny Snell. The Truck Cat is a story about cats and humans, immigration and identity, and homes lost and found. The event was streamed live from Springvale Library, where the book was read by its author, Deborah Frankel, followed by a drawing lesson from its illustrator, Danny Snell. The students loved the story of Yacoub, Mari and Tinka the cat, and continued their enjoyment of the book in class afterwards with some arts and crafts activities.

This year, 2,204,658 participants took part in National Simultaneous Storytime, and the Annunciation students were delighted to once again be part of such a fun and communal national event.






CRAFT CLUB
