

We recognise the importance of acknowledging the traditional custodians of the land on which our school is built, the Bunurong people, and wanted to do this in a way that is personalised to our school and which we have ownership of as a community.

Over the course of Term 2, Mr. Walshe and Miss Belinda worked with the Year 6 Leaders, to study a range of Acknowledgements of Country from different organisations. From these, we chose some ideas and phrases that we liked, and together crafted an Acknowledgement that shows respect to the Bunurong people in an authentic and heartfelt way, specific to Annunciation Primary School.

This Acknowledgement of Country will be used at the beginning of our school events, including assemblies and staff meetings, and will also be added to the staff's email signatures.



Annunciation Primary School respectfully acknowledges the Bunurong people of the Kulin Nation, as the traditional custodians and caretakers of the land on which we gather, learn and play.

We pay our respects to their elders past, present and emerging, and we recognise their unceded sovereignty over this Country.

The history and continuous culture of the Bunurong people is an important part of our shared story. May their strength and wisdom be with us always.



The trip was an incredible experience and provided us with insights into the frameworks that build the foundation for our cultures and the experiences of Aboriginal communities in Australia.
