
FATHER'S DAY CELEBRATIONS

MACSSIS SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT SURVEYS: 1ST- 19TH SEPTEMBER

Each year, our school community takes part in the Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools – School Improvement Surveys (MACSSIS). These surveys are designed specifically for Catholic schools and give students, staff and families the chance to share their experiences of school life.



In 2025, Yr 4–6 students will complete the survey in supervised sessions at school, while families and staff can complete theirs online at home during a three-week window, between **1**st – **19**th **September.** The surveys are run on a secure platform that protects the privacy of all participants, and the results will be shared with school leaders to help guide improvement.

Our community's opinions are critical to understanding how our school is performing – MACSSIS is a key data source for guiding the ongoing work to improve our school. By contributing, you help shape the direction of our school and ensure that every child can flourish in a safe, supportive and engaging learning environment.

Participation is completely voluntary, but every response helps. We warmly encourage families to take part and add their voices to this important process.

NEW END-OF-DAY DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

As part of our staff's ongoing professional learning through the Berry Street Education Model, we are working to build consistent and predictable routines across the school day. Beginning Monday 25th August, all classes will now be dismissed from their designated line-up spaces in the school yard.

At the end of the day, teachers will walk their students to their line-up area, where they will remain until the bell rings. Students will then be dismissed calmly to walk to their parents, or parents may choose to meet their children directly at the line-up space.

This new procedure mirrors the structure we already have in place at the beginning of the school day, creating a sense of consistency and security for students. It also allows for a calm and orderly end to the day while ensuring that all children go home safely with a known adult.

We thank our families for their support as we continue to strengthen routines that support student wellbeing, safety, and learning.

POETRY AND PYJAMAS NIGHT



VISION FOR ENGAGEMENT

Melbourne Archdiocese Catholic Schools (MACS) has launched the **Vision for Engagement**, which focuses on creating calm, respectful and inclusive classrooms where all students can learn and thrive.

Working alongside the **Vision for Instruction** and the **MACS 2030 plan**, this initiative highlights six key practices:

- · teaching respectful behaviour
- fostering belonging
- regular attendance
- · promoting wellbeing
- motivating learners
- meeting individual needs

These are supported by two strategies: a whole-school approach and a multi-tiered system of supports. While many schools already use these practices, the vision sets clear expectations and consistency across MACS.





For students, this looks like classrooms that are calm, inclusive, and supportive of both their learning and wellbeing. For teachers, it means clear direction, strong professional development, and more opportunity to focus on quality teaching.

At Annunciation, families won't see big changes overnight. We will continue to build on our strong wellbeing programs, school expectations, and calm learning environments, while gradually weaving in the **Vision for Engagement**.

This is an exciting step forward for Catholic schools across Melbourne, as together we work towards the 2030 goal of forming lives that enrich the world.

WEST GATE TUNNEL PROJECT

WEST GATE FREEWAY OUTBOUND LANES BETWEEN THE WEST GATE BRIDGE AND MILLERS ROAD WILL BE CLOSED OVER ONE WEEKEND FROM 11:59PM FRIDAY 29 AUGUST TO 5AM MONDAY 1 SEPTEMBER.

West Gate Freeway outbound closed: Fri 29 Aug - Mon 1 Sep

As we move closer to project completion, we'll be completing major works over a weekend on the West Gate Freeway outbound, between the West Gate Bridge and Millers Road.



To keep people safe:

All lanes on the West Gate Freeway outbound between the West Gate Bridge and Millers Road will be closed from 11:59pm Friday 29 August to 5am Monday 1 September

Construction activities include:

- Complete final surfacing of lanes and ramps and install final line marking
- Install, test and commission freeway management systems

Major delays expected of an extra 2hrs+ when travelling outbound via detours. Heavy congestion expected - please check traffic reports before you travel.

If travelling to the west, avoid using the West Gate Bridge. Thank you for your patience as we complete major works ahead of project opening in late 2025.


